

How to Stream Music From Your Mac Through an AirPort Express

Stream music wirelessly from your Mac to your stereo using iTunes and an AirPort Express! *For OS 10.5+*

DIRECTIONS TO ADD TO OR REPLACE YOUR EXISTING NETWORK

- 1.** Plug your AirPort into power near your stereo system. Connect the audio cables to the AirPort and the stereo (either RCA or fiber cables).
- 2.** Run the AirPort Express Setup Assistant on your Mac:
Applications > Utilities > AirPort Utility
- 3.** Select your AirPort from the list, and click Continue (it scans for the AirPort you just plugged in).
- 4.** Choose a name for your AirPort, and give it a password if you want to secure the network. (You can name it virtually anything you like!) Click Continue.

- 5.** Select:
 - a)** I have a wireless network and want to add AirPort Express or replace an existing device on my network and click Continue.
- 6.** Select **one** of the following choices:
 - a)** I want to replace an existing base station or wireless router with AirPort Express
 - b)** I want AirPort Express to wirelessly join my current network and click Continue.
- 7.** Choose your wireless network and click Continue.
- 8.** Review Summary and click Update.
- 9.** Now open iTunes.
- 10.** In the lower right hand corner of the iTunes window, you should see a drop down menu of the speaker sources available (it may default to "Computer"). Click the drop down menu to select the name of your AirPort network.
- 11.** Select a song, and listen to your music stream through your stereo!
