

bluetooth keyboard guide

Install the iPad into case

- » Remove Styrofoam packing and discard.
- » Pull the tab out and insert the iPad into the slot. Be sure to insert so that the camera slot matches up with the lens on the iPad.
- » Slip the tab behind the iPad. This will secure the iPad in the case. Note that all the holes and slots should be lined up.
- » Remove the plastic protective film on the top and bottom of the keyboard.

Charge the keyboard

Before you can use the keyboard for the first time, you must charge it.

- » Attach the USB cable provided from the keyboard (using the mini-USB end) to your computer's USB port OR to an AC power adapter (for a standard wall outlet).
- » Let the keyboard sit on the charger for at least 6 hours for the first charge. The keyboard is charged if the blue light flashes when you turn it on.

Pair the keyboard

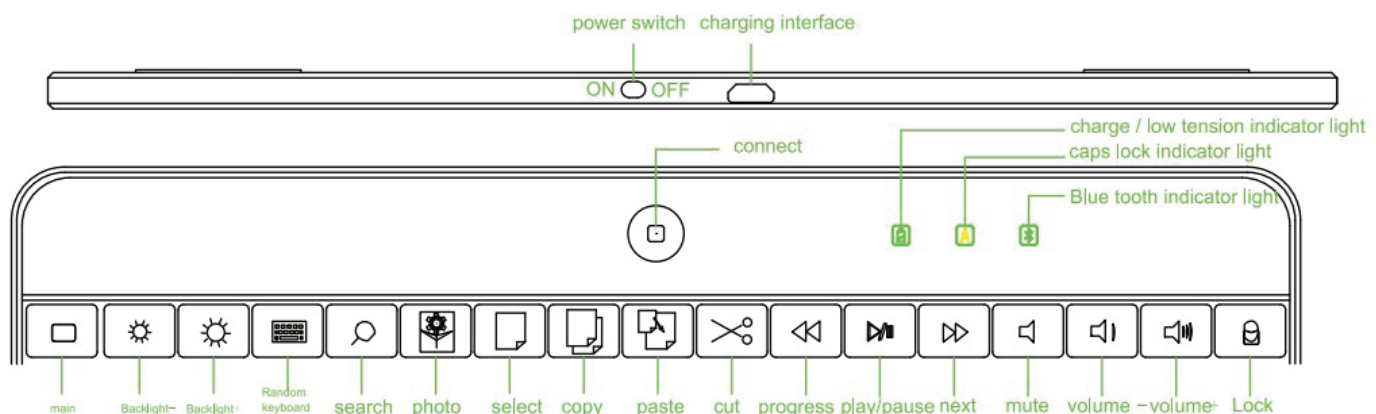
The keyboard must be paired with the device you want to use. Go to the "Settings" application on the iPad or iPhone and choose "Bluetooth." Then choose the device that you want to pair the keyboard with and you will get a message stating what password to use. Type in that password and the devices will pair and you will be ready to go.

Turn the keyboard on or off

- » Turn the keyboard on and off using the switch on the back of the keyboard (near the mini-USB port).
- » Make certain you turn off the keyboard when not in use to save battery life. Be sure to charge your keyboard every 5-10 uses (depending on usage time)

Fold the case so the iPad can stand up

There is velcro holding the iPad smooth with the case. You can pull the iPad away from the case (unfastening the velcro as you go). This will allow the case to bend and allow the iPad to stand up facing the keyboard. Because the keyboard is detachable, you can also use the keyboard away from its case.



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
